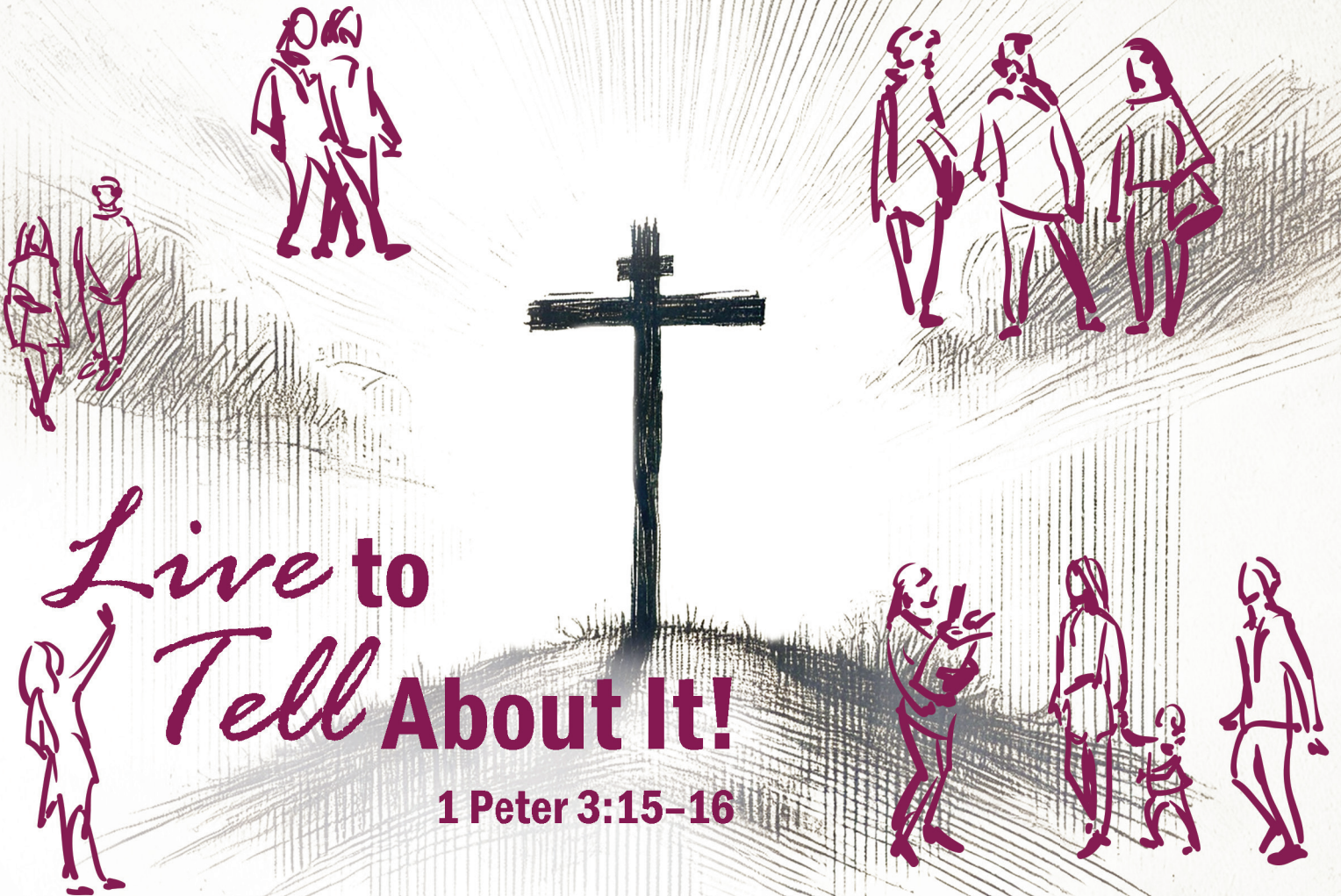

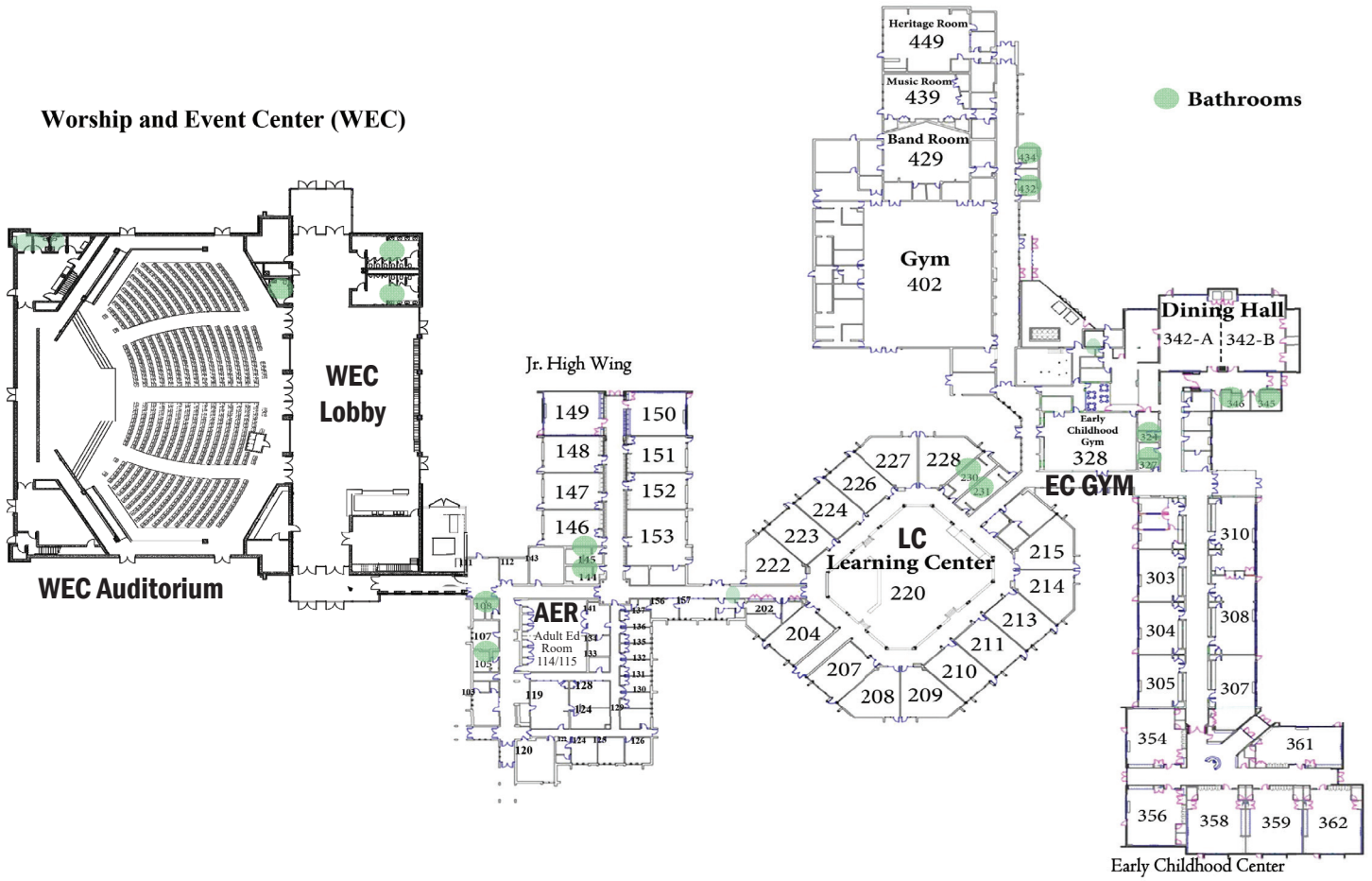

Welcome to our Congregational Ministry Summit—laypeople and pastors from all over the District gathered together for learning, thinking, praying, and connecting with one another, all for the purpose of being better able to “Live to Tell About It.”

Rev. Dr. Michael Zeigler began serving with LHM as Speaker of The Lutheran Hour in October 2018. Prior to that, he served as pastor of Epiphany Lutheran Church (2014–2018) and assistant pastor at Timothy Lutheran Church (2012–2014), both in St. Louis. Before becoming a pastor, he served as an aircraft maintenance officer in the Air Force.

Michael grew up in a military family, living throughout the U.S., from North Dakota to Alabama, Virginia to Colorado. His family moved eleven times before he finished high school in Springfield, Mo. He graduated from the U. S. Air Force Academy in 2001 with a general engineering degree and served 5 years in the Air Force. He left active duty in 2006 to prepare to be a pastor at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, completing a Master of Divinity in 2010 and a Ph.D. in 2014.

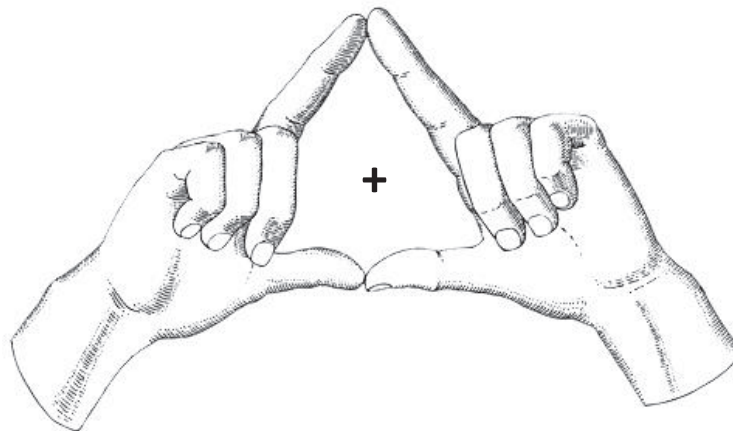

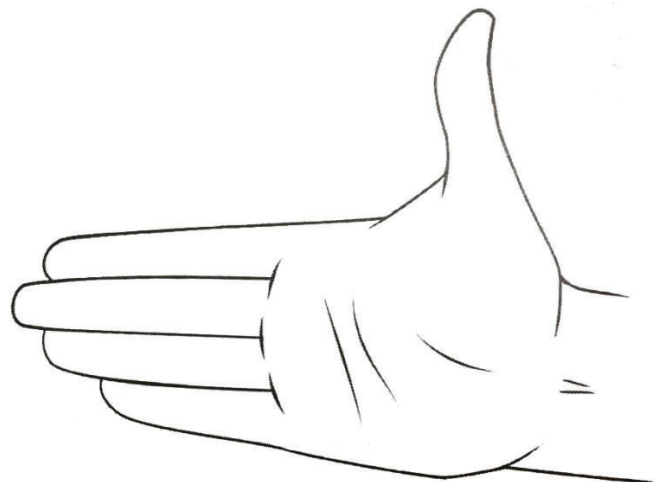

Stronger Together: Working with Your Community - Live to Tell

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. ... Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us (1 Peter 2:9–12, NIV).

LIVE

What do you do to LIVE in such a way that people start seeing Jesus or wondering about Jesus or hearing about Jesus or are asking about Jesus?

We live a life of Love & Witness & Outreach in order to glorify God by loving our neighbor and making disciples.

“But thanks be to God, who always leads us as captives in Christ's triumphal procession and uses us to spread the aroma of the knowledge of him everywhere. ¹⁵For we are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing. ¹⁶To the one we are an aroma that brings death; to the other, an aroma that brings life. And who is equal to such a task?” (2 Corinthians 2:14–16, NIV).

1. LIVE MEANS IT'S THE CULTURE OF THE CHURCH

The local “called out” people are obsessed with following Jesus in disciple making. (Luke 19:10)

a. THE NORMAL IS RELATIONAL DISCIPLE MAKING–

“Who is discipling you?”

“Who are you discipling?”

We believe that, as baptized believing children of God, we are called and empowered by God to be made and to make disciples who make disciples (Matthew 28:18–20).

CONNECT -> GROW -> BEAR FRUIT -> PLANT TREES

b. At our church, every disciple is taught and trained and expected to be a disciple maker.

What is a disciple?

i. A repentant believer in Jesus as Savior and Lord.

ii. And he said to them, “Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men” (Matthew 4:19, Mark 1:17).

- One who is Invited – “Come...”

- One who is Following Jesus – “follow me”

- One who is Conformed by Jesus – “I will make”

- One who is ON MISSION with Jesus – “you fishers of men.”

**OUR GOAL is not just to make believers.
Our goal is to make disciples who make disciples.**

2. LIVE MEANS IT'S A PERSONAL MISSION OF EACH OF JESUS' PEOPLE

Each person of the local church is a deployed missionary of Jesus.

We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God (2 Corinthians 5:20, NIV).

- a. **Daily Devotion** – Acts 2:42!
 - i. **Seeking the Kingdom** – (Prayer and faith in the work of our Risen With Us Lord) (www.theblessapp.com)
 - ii. **Hearing Jesus** – (Time in the Word and Prayer)
 - iii. **Knowing Neighbors** – (LOVE dies to self)
 - iv. **Serving Neighbors** – (LISTENING to God given opportunities to serve)
 - v. **Bringing the Kingdom** – (Pray Earnestly – Luke 10:2 – BRING THE KINGDOM 10:9 – heal the sick – cast out demons – bring Good News.)
 - vi. **Discipling Neighbors** – (Discovery Bible Study) (*Joining Jesus On His Mission by Greg Finke*)
- b. **The Reluctant Witness: Discovering the Delight of Spiritual Conversations** – Don Everts, Barna & Lutheran Hour Ministries
- c. **Spiritual Conversations Kit** – study with guide – *LHM.org*
- d. **Encouragement, Support, and Accountability** – Our personal mission is connected to Jesus' people for encouragement, support, and accountability. (Family, Group, Disciple Group (triad), Discipler,)
- e. **Resource Disciple Making - Discovery Bible Study** (Book Mark; *Onrock.net* - Hearing the word and putting it into practice - email me if you want more information.
- f. **Measure it** – (What you go for is what you will get. (Attendance, Baptisms, Giving, Buildings – vs Spiritual Conversations, Discipleship meetups)

3. LIVE MEANS BRINGING THE SHALOM OF GOD'S GOODNESS TO THE COMMUNITY WHERE WE LIVE –

(Outreach) [see Jeremiah 29:4–14]

- a. **Community Events** – Community Easter Egg Hunt, Memorial Day Parade, Summer Concerts, Pumpkin Bash, Winterfest
- b. **Community Service** – Zinser School Quad Clean-up, Teacher's Lounge Makeover, Vine Care Club After School Program, Fire & Police Chaplaincy
 - Millennials and Z's care more about what you do than what you say. (IDEA – Instead of running offering total in bulletin have a running total of **Community Service Hours**)

- c. **Walker Hope Collaborative** – (Doing good together for the flourishing of our community.) Facilitate a way to connect with neighbors and work alongside them for the good of our community. “**Better Together Kit**” – study and guide *LHM.org* & “*hopefulneighborhood.org*”

4. LIVE MEANS OUR CHURCH INVESTS IN THE FUTURE KINGDOM EXPANSION BEYOND US.

Dave Ramsey – Live like no one else so you can give like no one else later.

- a. Think Kingdom over Castle.
- b. Invest by planting some seed for future Gospel Outreach and Church Planting.
- c. Harvest Partnership – Michigan - “Helping Michigan District churches partner together to plant new churches.” (Harvest Table = 3 to 5 pastors or key leaders from 3–5 churches for 3 to 5 years or less in order to start new Gospel Outreach and/or Church plants together.)
 - i. Invest in 5 capitals – spiritual, relational, intellectual, physical, financial
 - ii. 10:02 Daily Kingdom Prayer – Luke 10:2
 - iii. 1.5 hour Once a month in-person gathering. Prayer, Witness and Outreach Focus, Seeking the Kingdom – What is Jesus doing in our midst?
 - iv. 30-minute Luke 10:2 prayer Zoom once a month.

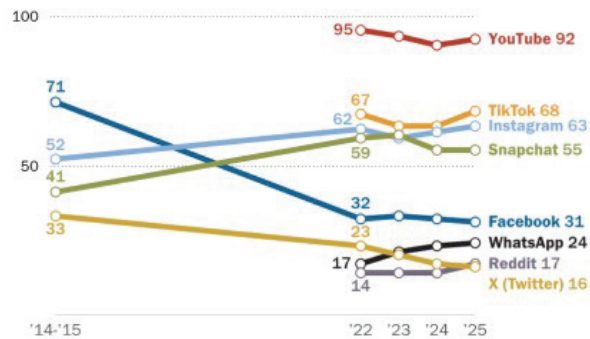

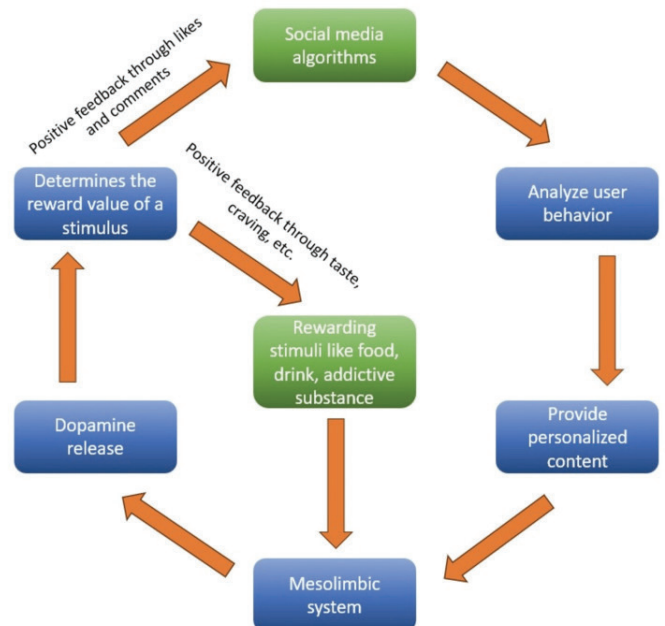

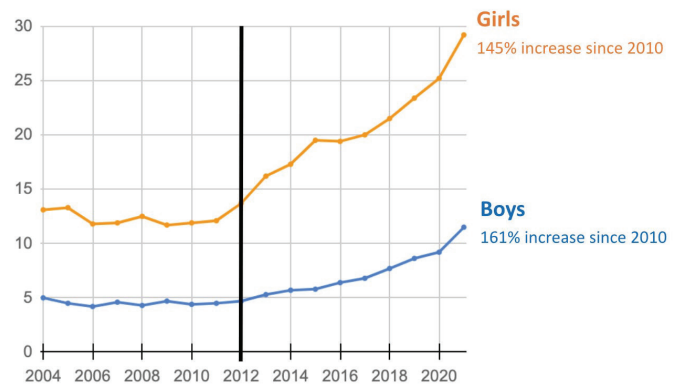
Social media, gaming, internet smart phone addiction leads to:

- A decrease in grey matter volume in the frontostriatal pathway affecting organization, decision making, and planning.
- A decrease in activity in the anterior cingulate cortex affecting motivation and learning.
- A decrease in melatonin and serotonin and circadian rhythm in hypothalamus affecting sleep.
- A decrease in grey matter volume in the amygdala affecting emotion and impulsive behavior.
- A decrease in grey matter in part of basal ganglia affecting planning, reward systems, learning and memory.

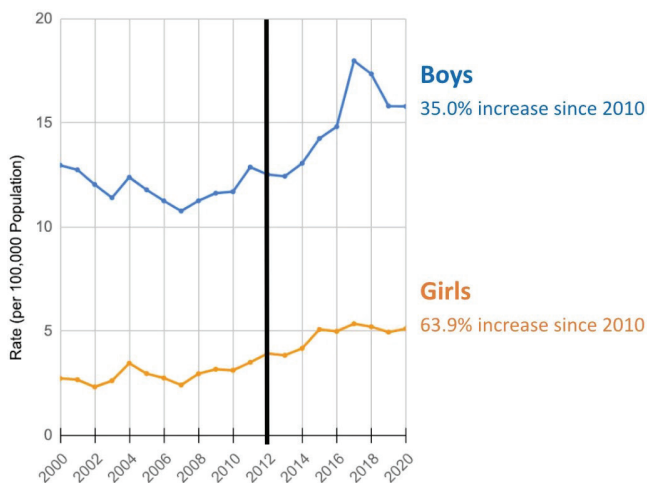
The is a positive correlation between the rise of smart phone use and suicide, depression, and anxiety.

Since 2010, the rate of major depression among young women has increased by 145% and among young men has increased by 161%.

% US Teens with Major Depression



US Teens, Suicides (Ages 15 – 19)



Since 2010, the rate of suicides among young men has increased by 35% and among young women has increased by 63.9%.

These statistics have caused the surgeon general to come out with recommendations on use of social media, gaming, and technology due to the clear impact on mental health.

We are all being:

Formed by Christ or Formed by Culture

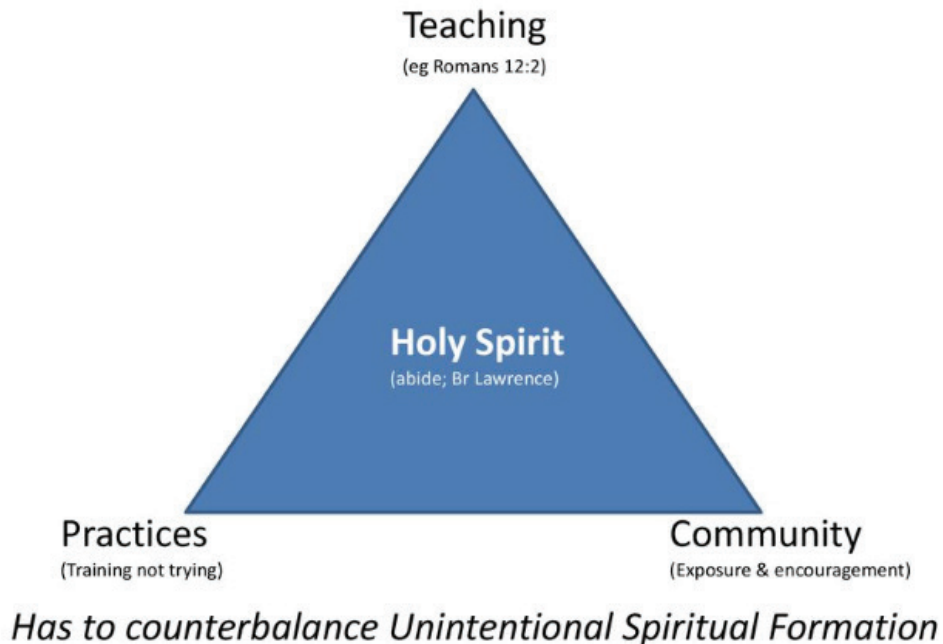
Our culture has unique challenges, but truthfully the same influences have been at work since the beginning of time. We all have influences for good and influences for evil in our lives.

- What are the influences for good? What are the unique influences for good in our culture?
- What are the influences for bad or downright evil? What are the unique influences for evil in our culture?
- We are all being formed. Formation is ongoing. It is intentional or unintentional.
- How is scrolling on YouTube, TikTok, Instagram, or your other favorite app influencing your formation? How about your friends and family?
- How is gaming online influencing your formation? How about your friends and family?

From Hitler to Mother Theresa we are all being formed. The real question is, 'who are we becoming like?'

-Dallas Willard

- Who are you becoming like?

- Who do you want to become like?

Jesus speaks very clearly about the culture's influence on us and our influence on the culture.

He uses three illustrations to teach how to be faithful and how to be His friends & followers.
He says we are like salt, light and branches.

SALT:

"You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again?" (Matthew 5:13).

- How do we "season" our school, teams, or friend groups with Jesus' love/truth?

- When is your "saltiness" lost or diluted (complacency, peer pressure)?

- How can we be ambassadors of goodness (stopping gossip, promoting kindness)?

- How can you "preserve" your online space from negativity (not spreading rumors, avoiding online fights)?

- What are practical ways to live differently without being preachy (kindness, honesty, serving)?

LIGHT:

“You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven” (Matthew 5:14–16).

- Where is the "darkness" in your world? (online bullying, hopelessness, gossip?)
- How can your life, even in small ways, be a "light" (integrity, helping someone, speaking truth)? What stops you from shining (fear, shame)?
- Authenticity: Is your online self different from your real self?
- Integrity: How can you be who God created you to be online?
- Influence: If you choose to use social media, how can you use Snap Chat, TikTok, Instagram, etc., to share God's truth/love (e.g., positive content, standing up for others)?
- Assertiveness & Boldness: How can you stand firm in your faith when friends mock it?
- What does "letting your light shine" look like in DMs, comments, or posts? (Kindness, encouragement, sharing faith when appropriate, not hiding it.)

BRANCHES:

“I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. “I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father’s glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. “As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commands and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one’s life for one’s friends. You are my friends if you do what I command. I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master’s business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.

This is my command: Love each other (John 15:1–7).

Your life is like a tree. The fruit you produce is a result of the vine or roots you are attached to.
If you are attached to Jesus, abiding in Jesus you will produce the fruit of the Spirit. - Galatians 5:22–23

Transformational Change: World Relief

Fruit: Results

Branches: Actions & Choices

Trunk: Values

Vine/Roots: Belief and Relationship with Jesus

- What fruit are you producing in your life?
- What fruit do you want to produce?
- What are you ready to change to be more effective at being salt and light?

Key Points:

- Influence, not Perfection: you don't have to be perfect, just guided by the Holy Spirit.
- Distinctiveness: your distinct life in Jesus is what makes an impact.
- Be creative. Use your gifts to share Jesus' love.
- Share what you are learning about Jesus. Focus on growing in relationships.
- Share what you are *for* more than what you are *against*.
- Jesus shared His love for people first before correcting. Jesus came to “set the world free not to condemn the world” (John 3:16-17).
- ... speak the truth in love, we grow to be mature in Christ (Ephesians 4:15).
- Presence: your presence (online and in real life) makes a difference.
- Glorify God: It's about pointing to Him.
